History:

Mammary mass

Unknown duration

Received: A 4.5 cm skin biopsy

DESCRIPTION/MICROSCOPIC FINDINGS/COMMENTS:

Microscopic description:

Mammary lissue; A total of 4 sections on 4 slides are examined from the submitted tissue specimen. This tissue contains an irregular disorganized multinodular partially cystic neoplastic proliferation. The proliferation is comprised of rounded to cuboidal to columnar epithelial cells arranged as tubuloduotal patterns, papillary cystic arrangements and solid lobules supported by a variable metaplastic connective tissue stromal component. The epithelial cells exhibit moderate nuclear pleomorphism but mitotic figures are relatively rare (2/10 hpf). In a few areas, the metaplastic stroma exhibits early cartilaginous metaplasia. Secondary inflammatory changes are present. Neither lymphatic invasion or vascular invasion can be found; however, the neoplasm appears to be extending within the mammary ductal system. Microscopic findings: Mammary carcinoma, complex cystic tubuloductal form, grade 1

This is a low grade malignancy warranting a cautiously optimistic prognosis with entire excision. The lesion does appear entirely excised where represented in the sections which may actually be curative in this situation. However, all represented cross-sectional suboutaneous margins, long/itudinal suboutaneous margins and deep margins are scant (less than 1 mm). Consequently, close observation for any additional similar recurring lesions is warranted.
